

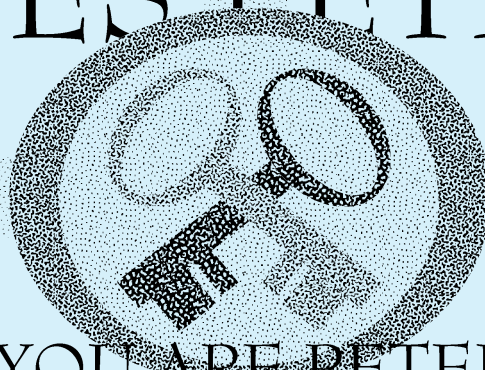

‘ROUND THE CAMPUS

Collegians are campus-bound these weeks before Labor Day, toting just the essentials: microwave, refrigerator, computer [perhaps one for the room and a laptop for taking notes in class], wrap-around sound, television, DVD player — all to somehow fit in a dorm room or students’ suite. “*Need an elevator pass?*”, most campus facilities are barrier free. “*Free swimming pool pass?*”, the RecPlex pool is probably Olympic-sized. Campus meal plans are more creative and varied [and the food very much better, I hope] than was my 1960s Fairfield experience. My Sophomore year, there was a kitchen fire one Sunday morning, to much student cheering. “Alas”, it re-opened the next day!

Jesuits were a very visible presence at Fairfield in my time [a dozen or more still serve as teachers and administrators]. Many lived in the dorms, and still do. Fairfield’s Dean of Men [the University was not co-ed until 1970] was Father Joe McCormick, a towering, but not at all formidable, presence — and a very popular Confessor among students. “Way back when”, we were expected to attend Mass twice a week; we thought ourselves far more “fortunate” than our College of the Holy Cross peers, who as I recall were still required to attend Mass five times per week. Then and now, I wish that much more emphasis had been placed on Sunday Mass — not only the spiritual importance of being there, but also understanding the Eucharist better -especially right after Vatican II— than the card handed in at the Loyola Chapel door-way.

Times have changed Praise God! Campus Ministry! Masses late on Sunday evenings are *de rigueur*, students are Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers. Peer ministry takes many forms; counselors have willing ears and generous hearts; service opportunities abound in nearby communities. Many Catholic colleges offer winter break, summer, and post-graduate service programs. Campus ministers find their work as exciting and rewarding as it is demanding and challenging — striving to be a strong and effective campus presence, wanting so much to help in a crisis situation, eager to foster student involvement and participation in so many ways.

Going away? Commuting nearby? Wherever your college or university - Catholic, Ivy League, sports team power-house, state-sponsored, private, military service academy, community college — there is almost invariably a Campus Ministry presence. The strength of that presence depends very much on priest and deacon chaplains and lay campus ministers; in turn, campus ministers are the first to stress that effective campus ministry is very much student- driven and student-oriented.

Junior Year college tour, pre-admission interview, orientation week, course registration days --phone calls, e-mails and text messages with a new room-mate — all of them good times to ask, “*Is Campus Ministry on the Web Site?*” ... “*How can I meet or get in contact with someone working in Campus Ministry?*” ... “*When are Masses - on weekends, during the week?*” ... “*Do you think I could be a Lector?*” ... “*Me? — a Eucharistic Minister?*” — *I would love to!*” Don’t be afraid to ask! Don’t settle for “*I don’t know ... I guess it is around campus some-where ...*” — any more than you would accept an elevator key you do not need, nor that fake swimming pool pass.

Campus Ministry — at your college, your university. To “modify” one of Yogi Berra’s famous observations, “*It’s so crowded; I guess everybody goes there*”. Check it out ... It is an essential! “*Don’t miss it!*”

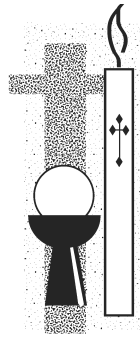

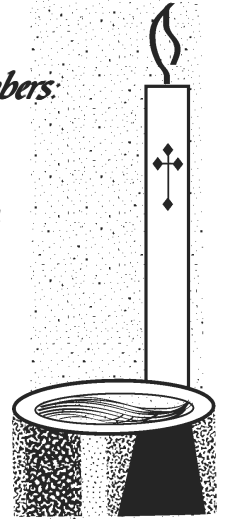

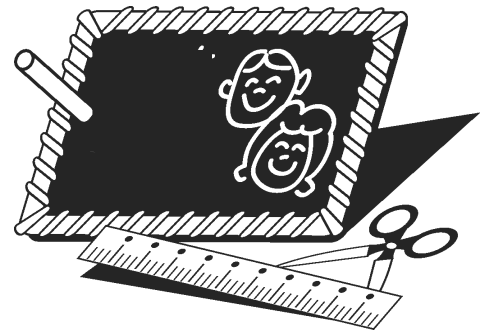

Teens @Stpats August 21, 2001

Who are you? That question seems easy enough. In about two or three weeks, you will have a whole bunch of teachers asking you that question. They essentially want to find out your name. But your name doesn't really say that much about you. Who are you? What do people think of when they think of your name? Smart? Funny? Athletic? Quiet? Loud? Who are you? Believe it or not that is the question that you will take a lifetime to answer. Every time you make a decision you are answering the question. Who are you? From the viewpoint of Christian faith, you a son or daughter of your father in heaven. You are called to be a follower of Jesus. You are called to love and serve others. But you must decide: who are you? It is very easy to simply be like everyone else. Buy the same clothes; use the same gadgets; watch the same shows and movies. But then, who are you? Answer that question not with words but with attitudes, values, actions. Who are you? Who will you become? In today's Gospel, Jesus asks a variation on that question. "Who do people say that I am"? Jesus has been teaching and preaching in Palestine for a year or two. His reputation has spread like wildfire. But who is He? The easy answer is that he is a prophet like Elijah or John the Baptist. But that's not the right answer. Jesus may be a prophet, but He is much more. So Jesus then asks, "Who do you say that I am?" And it is Peter who gets the answer right: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God". (The word "Christ" mean "messiah"). Jesus is not just a great prophet. He is not just a great teacher. He is not just an extraordinary spiritual genius. He is not even just the messiah. Jesus is all those things and more. He is the Son of the living God. In this human being, Jesus of Nazareth, God himself has lived among us. Jesus then is the intersection of the human and divine. Jesus reveals to us what it means to be human. Jesus reveals to us who God is for us.

Don't you wish Jesus was alive today? Wouldn't it be great to encounter Him? He is alive today! Jesus of Nazareth died on a cross outside Jerusalem two thousand years ago, but Jesus the risen Lord lives in and through His Spirit. So Jesus says to Peter: You are Peter and upon this Rock I will build my Church. It is in the Church, the community of faith, that the Spirit will bring the risen Lord to life in us. Jesus asks you the same question that he asked his disciples: Who do you say that I am? How you answer that question will determine a great deal about the other question: Who are you?
