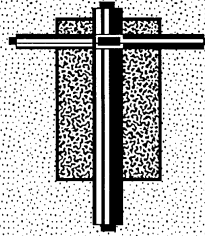


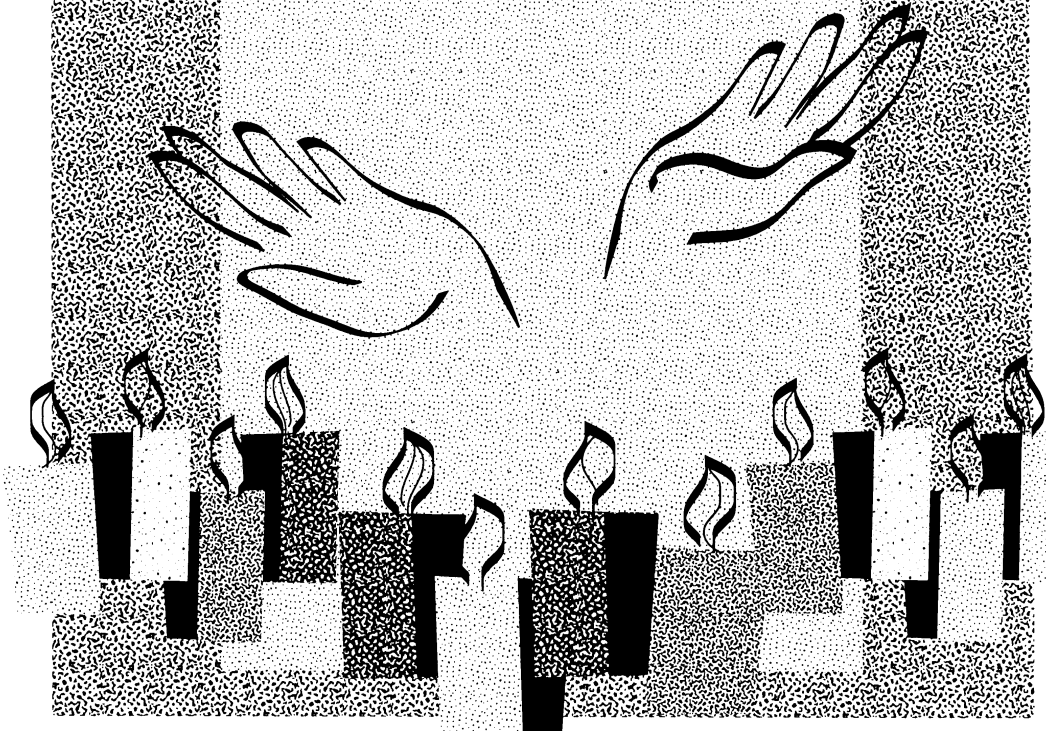

ARE WE “FAITH LITERATE”? THE “AILMENT”

A recent news story [*New York Times* 09/28/10] described a telephone survey taken a few months ago by the independent Pew Forum on Religion and Public Life. There were 3,400 participants, each of them asked thirty-two questions about the Bible, Christianity, other faith traditions, familiar religious figures, church-state issues. [Thirty-two seems a lot of questions for a phone survey; I doubt that I would have been that patient.] Far more importantly, the results — not very encouraging, I thought.

Highest scorers? Surprisingly, atheists and agnostics! — who seem to have some knowledge of what they do not believe! Highest scorers among religious groups? Jews and Mormons. And Catholics? - on average, we correctly answered sixteen - half! — of the questions! Cold comfort knowing that four out of five participants knew that Mother Teresa of Calcutta was Catholic. Nobel Prize recipient? Centennial Birthday? A commemorative postage stamp? For her, something else, someone else, mattered so much more!

Especially troubling — even a crisis of faith among us! — the survey’s statistic that forty-five per cent of Catholic respondents [how many participants were Catholic, or consider themselves practicing Catholics, was not indicated] were unaware of our Church’s fundamental - foundational! - belief that bread and wine, consecrated at every Eucharist, truly becomes the Body and Blood of Jesus!

I vaguely recall a similar survey of Catholics some years ago, perhaps conducted by the same Pew Forum, whose results about belief in Jesus’ Eucharistic presence were even more startling. Then, 33% of Catholics indicated their belief that Jesus is really and truly present --Body and Blood, soul and divinity - whenever Eucharist is celebrated. Be it a survey result of one-half, or one-third, that statistic is a “wake-up call” for all of us!

Recall Jesus’ words of institution: “*Take this, all of you, and eat it: **this is My Body***” “*Take this, all of you, and drink from it: **this is my Blood.***” Eucharist is not a symbol, a replica, a memory of a past event. Jesus’ words at the Last Supper, “*Do this in memory of me.*” — our great joy, our priceless invitation, our life-giving and life-changing challenge: “**Do this in memory of me.**”

Admittedly, after Vatican II, some children’s catechetical materials, and some resources for faith formation, were rather weak in their content. That situation has been remedied for many years - thanks to parents, catechetical leaders, Bishops, the publishers themselves. Ours and many other Dioceses have clear and specific guidelines, and approved catechetical resources --all meant to enhance and ensure proper, age-appropriate, doctrinal content in children’s text books, parent supplements, teacher and catechist resources, adult education materials.

One wonderful resource? *The Catechism of the Catholic Church.* Some of us recall the Catechisms of our childhood, and their familiar question-and-answer format. *The Catechism* is divided into four sections — what we believe [based on our familiar Apostles’ Creed], how we worship [Eucharist and the other Sacraments], how we pray [especially the Lord’s Prayer], and our moral life. *The Catechism* does not simply enumerate teachings of belief, worship, prayer, and moral issues, but also has very easily readable explanations, Biblical foundations, historical information about each component. What a gift! — helping us to believe, to worship, to pray, to live Gospel values — and at the same time, being able to know why we do so!
