**“SOMETHING PATRICK-AL\*\*\*\*”**

**TO OUR SEMINARY: “FOUR SCORE ...” AND MORE!!**

Perhaps, a few very “senior”, parishioners remember it; no doubt, more lifelong parishioners read of it, or heard about it from their parents and others. September 28, 1930 — eighty years ago Tuesday, Immaculate Conception Seminary was dedicated. Quite a day it seems to have been: twenty-five thousand people attending, a thousand of whom arrived on the *Rensselaer*, which docked just north of the property. A special LIRR train was engaged; twenty buses transported people from the railway station. Five thousand cars parked on the Seminary grounds. By all accounts, traffic on West Neck Road that day was “congested”. Describing the Seminary, and a Depression-era Capital Campaign for its construction, long-time *Brooklyn Tablet* editor Patrick F. Scanlon called it, “... *the biggest, most important, most urgent and most influential work the diocese has ever done.*”

West Neck Road is less-heavily travelled most days; much has changed about Seminary life these eighty years. During World War II, an Army biplane landed on Seminary property, its pilot Army Chaplain Father Stephen Stolz, later Pastor in East Hampton. Do you recall seeing seminarians downtown on Thursday afternoons in the 1960s? — no missing our black suits and ties, riding in the back of a truck [I bought a mop my first trip into town!], enjoying a plate of pasta and a glass of wine at Orlando’s - and usually, meeting Frank Glimm in Oscar’s Book Store! What a blessing during the Seminary’s first forty years having Amityville Dominican Sisters, responsible for “three squares a day” and so much more - especially their prayers! Seminarians are much fewer in number than was true in the yester-years. Some are older, bringing various life experiences to their formation for priesthood. Others add much to a multi-cultural atmosphere in our Seminary. Pat Scanlon was correct in ways he could never have imagined [and probably would have opposed!]. Our Seminary prepares candidates for Permanent Diaconate; graduate theology courses provide seminarians, religious, and lay students with opportunities to earn Masters and Doctorate degrees in Theology and Ministry. While Fr. Stolz was probably told to “Take off! This instant!”, our Seminary now welcomes priests and others for retreats, days of prayer, and many other opportunities for spiritual renewal. Some Seminary events are open to the public, like Advent Lessons and Carols, lectures by guest speakers. Our parishioners are among devoted long-time, members of the Seminary Board of Governors and the Friends of the Seminary.

Describing our Seminary in a recent column in our Diocesan newspaper, Bishop Murphy praised our Seminary faculty “... *as fine a faculty as exists anywhere in this part of the country*”. Not just his words, but the comments of other Bishops whose seminarians are trained here. This academic year, the Seminary is in the process of renewing its ten-year accreditation with two theological accrediting agencies.

There is some discussion about some type of Seminary amalgamation [with New York’s St. Joseph’s Seminary, Dunwoodie]. Rumors are flying about all sorts of scenarios; as I write this, no decision has been announced. My “vote”? Having Immaculate Conception Seminary “just up the road” for many more years!!!

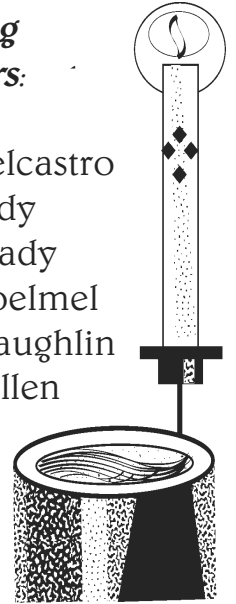

**Teens @Stpats** 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the Year 9.26.10

News item: Government statistics this week indicate that more than forty million Americans live in poverty here in the United States. One in every seven Americans is poor. That is a stunning fact. The numbers have gone up recently, but not by that much. Poverty in America is always more prevalent than we usually imagine. Why? Because we live on Long Island where the numbers are little better and where people tend to live in areas that are somewhat insulated from poverty. Globally, 925 million people are chronically malnourished. That's actually an improvement from the one billion from a few years ago.

With these facts in mind, let's take a look at two of today's readings

**Reading 1: Amos 6: 1,4-7**

Amos was a prophet and prophets were a pain in the neck. The problem with prophets is that they are focused on what God wants and we tend to want what we want. Amos was furious that the rich in the land had ignored the poor. He uses a very good word to describe them: complacent (pretty good SAT word too). Someone who is complacent is very pleased with themselves and their situation. The problem: the complacent care only about their situation and not about the poor. The complacent think that the good times will always be there for them.

Amos is one of the least known and most important prophets in the Old Testament. He is the first prophet to make justice the key to the covenant with God. For Amos, worship is meaningless without care for the needy.

**Gospel: Luke 16: 19-31**

I mentioned that there are more than forty million poor people in the United States. Of course, you didn't make them poor. Its certainly not your fault in the least. But what can you and I do to help the poor. The answer: something, anything, but not nothing.

The story that Jesus tells in the Gospel today is all about the need to do something. In the story called the Rich man and Lazarus, the rich man walks past a poor beggar each day and does nothing to help him. The rich man dresses in fancy clothes and dines on the finest foods. And he simply ignores the poor man. He did not make the poor man poor. He doesn't kick him, or yell at him, or call the police. He just ignores him. And according to the story that Jesus tells, the rich man winds up in hell for ignoring the poor man. Ouch! Jesus is like the prophet Amos- not afraid to tell it like it is from God's point of view.

So what can you do? Well, right here in the parish, you can come downstairs and make sandwiches for the needy after the 5:30 mass. Bring a pound of lunch meat (bologna, ham, roast beef) and join the group. It doesn't take long.

**Saint of the week** : Monday, Sept. 27: Vincent DePaul. Vincent was a priest whose life mirrored the themes of this week's reading. At first, he was a very complacent priest, concerned more with his own comfort than anything else. But the face to face encounters with poor led hi to become one of the greatest champions of the poor and the patron saint of the Church's charitable endeavors.

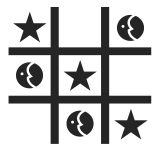
